

## Reformation

Hebrews 9:10 — “All of these ordinances were imposed on them until the time of the reformation.”

**Strong’s Concordance** says the word reformation means “*to straighten thoroughly; messianic restoration*” —

**Webster’s Dictionary** says, “*the act of reforming; correction or amendment of life, manners, or of any thing vicious or corrupt — reformation of the age — the act of forming anew — the change of religion from the corruptions of papery to its primitive purity.*”

Only in the book of Hebrews is the word reformation used. This is the culmination of the reformation started at the time of Luther. What is happening will make the last dispensation called “the church age” part of history, only a remembrance.
