“Go ye therefore and disciple all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost.” Matthew 28:19

I would like to give the *Strong's Concordance* definition of the word “church”. It will make straight some thinking of the Christian world.

Church — ek (Greek) — the point from whence motion or action begins. Eklesia — the called out ones who have been rooted in the Father from whence all action or motion begins. Understand that the church as we know it today does not come from God, but from the world. You cannot call a united sperm and egg in the womb a baby anymore than you can call the church in the wilderness “the church”, for much can happen to prevent the birth of the baby. Not until we come out a complete new creation are we called “the church”.

There is a wake-up call going out to the “church” in the womb. Paul says we must “awake unto righteousness”. The only righteousness our Adam man can know is self-righteousness. Therefore all our own righteousness, like a filthy rag, must be cast aside by obedience unto death. The Spirit and the bride say, “Come.” Unless we see God’s righteousness shining as a beacon of light we are a lost humanity.

Before I start writing what has to be written let me say this. In the 60’s and 70’s many people left the jobs they had and began seeking the Lord. They are to be recognized as those who began the race and I respect them for that. However the vision they had was falling short of the glory of God. The perfecting of the saints, or redeeming the world back to God or being conformed into the image of Christ was never preached. Perhaps this is because the price to be paid is too great. Those who began the race wanted their families, their ministries, the honor from men, etc., etc. That means nobody led the people through the cross, thus overcoming the devil, death and the grave. We need a greater light, a greater teaching.

Now read the above scripture: “Go and disciple the nations.” Two things to notice in this scripture: Jesus was talking to only those who had been discipled. Then notice they were given instructions to disciple the nations. Wow, that means that discipleship is a must before being sent out to do the Lord’s work which is to disciple the nations. We will cover later the steps in becoming a disciple.

Have you seen anyone from the “so-called” church go and **disciple** any nation?? This infers that all the proselytizers of Christianity thus far have run hither and yon in vain preaching a gospel after their own “in part” understanding — doing many wonderful things in His name — but in their own spirit — their iniquity separating them from God. To these people, leaders, if you will, Jesus said, “Get you hence, I never knew you.” He said that only to tell them that there was a deeper and final walk with Him that was the culmination of our walk with Christ — the unveiling of all mysteries, the final chapter in the long journey called “Christianity”.

So, my dear charismatic leaders, this is the hour to lay down all and get to know the Father. For if you know not the Father, you know not Christ. The reaper is at the door. Let us be certain that we have sown a pure gospel. Let us be sure we have sown so as to bring us and all we have planted into the “kingdom of God”. Is the gospel planted in your hearts a gospel that creates a new man or is your gospel one that makes Adam a “good man” or perhaps we have a gospel that will make one have treasures on earth or make Israel or America the focus of our attention. You, who have been responsible for the gospel will be held accountable for what you have given the people. So it behooves all of us to not think we are the great apostles when the true apostles are yet to be revealed.

Now let us review how we become Jesus' disciple. You will always fall short of the glory of God and remain a sinner unless you are disciplined. The disciples had overcome death, had forsaken all, had a complete change of heart and had entered a new age called Christianity. Thus they laid the foundation for a new world. We are to do nothing less.

Luke 14:26 — He said these divisive words to the multitudes. "If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters and yes even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." And again verse 33 says, "So therefore, no one of you can be my disciple who does not give up all his own possessions." Ouch, did I step on someone's toes with that one?? Then he goes on to say, "Therefore, salt is good; but if even salt has become tasteless, with what will it be seasoned??? It is useless either for the soil or for the manure pile, it is thrown out. He who has ears to hear, let him hear." Do you hear the call???

What will God do to force the church into discipleship?? The only way into the new age is through discipleship. Discipleship transforms the mind. Discipleship allows the Spirit to birth us.

Now he begins this verse by saying, "If anyone comes to me." That means they had an experience with Christ. As a matter of fact, that was the door that should lead to discipleship.

Now I am going to say something that will label me as a heretic. You cannot be a member of the church that is now in existence and a member of the kingdom of

God. For the church is "of the world" and those who love the world, hate God. (1 John)

In a recent article written about the church and the "trendsetters" of the 60's and 70's, Piecemakers was not even mentioned. Piecemakers is the church. To become a member, you do not join us, you seek God. And if you obey God, and if you are allowing him to change you or awaken you, we will have fellowship one with another. For if you are not against us you are for us. Our fellowship is in the Spirit, not in doctrines or rituals or any such thing.

Lest the usurper that calls itself "the church" has a rude awakening, I fear He will go to another people who know Him not. It is much easier for God to get virgin soil of someone who has never known Him than to try and teach one steeped in wrong teaching. How many of you reading this would be willing to come out of the unclean thing you have created in the wilderness and allow the Spirit to get your will, your blood, your all??? I see no hands being raised for I fear you either cannot hear the urgency of this call or your pride and arrogance and unbelief are hindering you.

The night is far spent and the rays of a new age are shining. Only a complete change will allow you to ride the waves into God's new age or into "His kingdom".
